

Pharmacy Spotlight: Slentrol™

Prescription-only combination appetite suppressant and fat absorber.
- **Active ingredient:**
Dirlotapide
- **Dosage form:**
Oral Solution

- **Major use:**
To help obese dogs lose weight in conjunction with a diet and exercise program.
- **How it works:**
Slentrol

TM works two ways: it works inside the small intestine to block some of the fat the dog ingests from being absorbed into the bloodstream. Although not completely understood, it also works to make the dog feel satiated, so he will eat less at each meal. Less food consumed at meals means fewer calories taken in, and this, along with regular exercise, leads to weight loss. The dosage of this drug is adjusted each month as the animal loses weight, so the use of Slentrol™ must be monitored by a veterinarian.

Breed: Basset Hound
