Clean With Your Pet's Health in Mind

It is easy to understand how your small pet's health is tied to the cleanliness of her

cage. But what many people do not consider is how they clean their pet's environment and what potential toxins may be introduced to it, despite the best of intentions. Daily:

- Empty and wash her <u>food bowl</u> using warm water and a small amount of mild soap. Thoroughly rinse and dry the bowl before returning it to your pet's environment and filling it with <u>food</u>.



• Empty and wash her <u>water bottle</u> using warm water and a small amount of mild soap. To ease the cleaning of your pet's water bottle, use a <u>bottle brush</u>. Thoroughly rinse the water bottle before refilling it with clean, fresh water and returning it to your pet's environment.

Weekly:

- Remove and replace all <u>bedding</u> and/or <u>litter</u>.
- Wash and disinfect the <u>cage</u> bottom and any <u>toys</u>. <u>Nontoxic Cage Cleaner & Deodorizer</u> simplifies cleaning and leaves a fresh scent. As with all cleaners, rinse thoroughly and dry well.
- Wash and disinfect any cage accessories, such as <u>climbing shelves</u>, dens, or <u>beds</u>, per the manufacturer's cleaning instructions for each product. Rinse thoroughly and dry well.


